


### **Historical Overview**

Tunisia, direct heiress of ancient Carthage, owes the Carthaginians the first olive plantations in the country, on the island of Cyraunis (now Kerkena), Cap Bon, Byzacène and more particularly near Hadrumète (Sousse). Driven by the desire to make Africa an olive oil producing region, the Roman emperors promulgated laws encouraging the expansion of olive groves and giving bonuses to farmers who planted olive trees on uncultivated land or uprooted them to replant new trees. In short, the olive oil trade has always been a source of wealth for all civilizations that marked the history of Tunisia.





#### **AUTOCHTHON OLIVE VARIETIES**

Tunisia is the repository of a rich varietal heritage; thanks to its geographical location, at the crossroads of many civilizations, at the crossroads of trade routes between the East, Africa and Europe, and thanks to the migrations of Andalusian populations.

Nevertheless, two varieties, the Chemlali and the Chetoui, are the main varieties grown in Tunisia, although there are others, called secondary, more specific to small regions like the Oueslati, the Chemchali, the Zalmati, the Zarrazi, Gerboui and Sayali, and many other varieties grown in smaller areas.



#### **CHEMLALI**

This variety is cultivated in hot coastal zone and in the lower steppe. It is present in nearly 85% of olive plantations and participates in more than 80% of the national production of olive oil. It dominates the olive groves of the Center and the South.

The Chemlali olive from Sfax gives at the beginning of maturity a very fruity oil, not very bitter and not very spicy, with mainly aromas of green almond, grass fresh and rarely apple.



#### **CHETOUI**

Cultivated in the coastal region, valleys and in the North height plateaus, this variety populates the largest part of the northern olive groves. It produces an unfixable and fruity oil with intense aromas of green almond, accompanied with a

bitter and pungent taste perceived with intense medium to strong. The intensity of bitterness decreases during maturation but still remains noticeable.

This oil is highly valued for its content of phenolic compounds and antioxidants.



#### **Oueslati**

This variety is grown in the Kairouan region. The extracted oil is very balanced and fruity, slightly bitter with a flavor reminiscent of fresh almonds.



#### Zarrazi

Cultivated in the South, mainly in the oases, sometimes presenting some local variations, this variety, in addition to the production of excellent table olives, is highly valued for its high oil content, despite its productivity is alternating.

At the sensory level, Zarrazi olives from the South gives a slightly bitter, slightly spicy fruity oil and slightly sweet, with notably aromas of fig and sometimes a scent of apple and grass.

In addition, there are table varieties such than the Meski, Sayali, Tounsi, Besbessi, Marsaline, Beldi and Fouji whose crops are essentially extensive.



### **ONH - TUNISIAN OLIVE OIL**

#### **FACTS & FIGURES**

Olive oil represents an economic activity of considerable importance for Tunisia in addition of its great cultural, social and environmental significance.

During last ten years, Tunisia produced an annual average of 211 thousand tons of olive oil of which 80% extra virgin olive oil. It represent about 7% of the world olive oil production. At the international level, Tunisia is ranked the second world producer of olive oil after the Europeen Union and the fourth exporter behind Spain, Italy and Greece with an annual average of 180 thousand tons.

Since 2007, Tunisia made in place an active promotion policy to expand packed olive oil and succeed to diversify markets and develop exported quantitites which reach 30 thousand tons mostly under Tunisian brands.

#### **MISSION & VISION**

The National Olive Oil Office (ONH), placed under the guardianship of the Ministry of Agriculture, water Ressources and Fisheries, assumes the following missions:

- Securing all interventions for the benefit of the olive sector, related mainly to the implementation of national campaigns against pests harmful to olives, training of specialized manpower and encouraging scientific agronomic research.
- Valuation of Tunisian olive oil through specialized training sessions on quality control and tasting qualifications.

- Production and sale of olive plants .
- Intervention to regulate the olive oil market and preserve the interests of stakeholders in the olive sector.
- Securing the purchase of olive oil at the production and its commercialization,
- Securing local market supply of subsidized vegetable oils.

The National Olive Oil Office's vision consists mainly on the improvement of the productivity on the olive sector and to continue to keep improving quality of olive oil.
